



WINNICA TURNAU PINOT NOIR 2022

WINE DESCRIPTION

A red wine made from the noble Pinot Noir grape, vintage 2022. It was aged for 30 months in oak barrels. Elegant and refined. The nose reflects the varietal's fruit character, with aromas of strawberry and cranberry. A very subtle touch of oak adds a delicate smoky note. The palate is juicy, with fine, subtle tannins. Flavors of cherry, red currant, chocolate, and black pepper come through. The accompanying acidity brings harmony and freshness, echoing the wine's inviting fruit expression on the nose.

TERROIR

Winnica Turnau is located in Baniewice, in the southwestern part of the West Pomeranian Voivodeship. This unique region is influenced by air masses from the Atlantic Ocean and the Baltic Sea, as well as the proximity of the Oder River. All these factors shape a climate characterized by a long growing season, warm summers, and mild winters. Such conditions favor the cultivation of demanding grape varieties, allowing them to reach optimal ripeness while maintaining high acidity. Our region is distinguished by a rich network of oxbow lakes, gently rolling moraine hills, and an abundance of flora and fauna. The vineyard is situated on a moraine hill, where the predominant soils are sandy-clay, clay, moderately compact, and moderately permeable. This terroir, combined with ecological viticulture, results in grapes of exceptionally high quality.

WEATHER DURING THE GROWING PERIOD

The winter of 2021/2022 was snowy, with a high number of frosty days. Early spring saw little precipitation, and the entire spring season was rather dry, although this did not delay vegetation. No spring frosts occurred. The summer was warm but also rainy. Autumn was dry, with moderate temperatures. The harvest period was relatively long, particularly for the latest-ripening varieties.
